Particulars of Allegation (as amended)

You, a registered pharmacist,

- 1. On or about 9 April 2021, submitted a fitness information form to NHS England in which you:
- 1.1. answered "No" to the question "Are or have been to your knowledge, subject to any investigation into, or proceedings relating to, your fitness to practise by a licensing body".

[Admitted and found proved]

- 2. Your action at 1 above was dishonest in that you:
- 2.1. knew that you were subject to an ongoing investigation, since 14 May 2019, by the General Pharmaceutical Council.

[Not Admitted and found not proved]

By reasons of the matters set out above, your fitness to practise is impaired by reason of your Misconduct.

- 1. The Committee therefore issued a warning to the Registrant in the following terms:
 - "Your failings amount to breaches of the following standards for pharmacy professionals:
 - Standard 2: pharmacy professionals must work in partnership with others: You failed to work in partnership with NHS England when you made an assumption, without checking, that the Council had closed down its investigation into the first concern.
 - Standard 5: pharmacy professionals must use their professional judgement: You
 breached a fundamental principle of professionalism, namely to take appropriate care
 when making formal declarations in regulatory paperwork, when you filled in the
 form inaccurately.
 - Standard 9: pharmacy professionals must demonstrate leadership: You failed to show leadership as one of the Directors of the Pharmacy company you wished to register with NHS England, and as Superintendent Pharmacist of the business which you were applying to transfer to the new company.

The Committee is satisfied that you have demonstrated that you understand the importance of completing formal documents with care and attention and of taking care to check any facts which you are not sure of. It is reassured that you have implemented changes to your practice in order to avoid similar conduct in future.

The Committee considers that this warning is necessary to mark your misconduct and to uphold and declare proper professional standards and thereby ensure public confidence in the profession.

This warning will be published in the register and remain in place for 12 months".
